PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I am proud to be a part of this club.

The Tuggeranong Valley Australian Football Netball Club has become a club of choice in Tuggeranong for netball and is the third largest AFL club in Canberra.

What we have been able to achieve as a community club run by unpaid volunteers has been truly remarkable. The selflessness of so many people doing their part, whether it be coaching, managing, umpiring, standing in the canteen, taking photos on game day, setting up grounds or being on the board, is what makes the difference between a good experience and a bad one.

Yes, there is always more that could be done or different ways to do things, but these tremendous and remarkable people give their all to do the best they can. For this, I am truly grateful.

You only have to look at this list to see what a massive year we've had:

- 100 Years of AFL In Canberra with Heritage Round at Manuka Oval
- 25 Years of women's footy in Tuggeranong. We have the largest participation numbers in Canberra junior girls. 63% of the board are female and, across the AFL programs, a 60/40 split of male and females, well exceeding the AFL's 20% target.
- Share the Dignity Round for netball
- Community Week where netball held a PJ/Oodie night, junior teams 12 and up participated in the AFL Ahead of the Game Program and other grades participated in senior clinics.
- Social events season launches, life members/past players day (the biggest attendance in a long time) and the comedy night. Focus on fun and laughter and we nailed that!
- The Brand Identity Working Group that will hopefully complete the last step of the amalgamation in terms of replacing our existing 4 logos to one united logo.
- A 10-year partnership with St Mary Mackillop Catholic College to redevelop the oval surface, along with lighting, scoreboard and spectator areas, eventually leading to netball use as well.
- An Infrastructure Working Group that has seen us gain a new scoreboard, merchandise van and has invested in ongoing work with local and federal governments, and the AFL, in relation to a longer-term vision to develop Kambah, and
- Refurbishment of Gordon oval pavilion, which is now finally complete after the fire two years ago and ready to go for next season.

All the off-field work to build our community and our culture translates to success on field too, with:

- 11 of our 12 junior competitive teams, 2 of our 5 senior teams and 6 of our 13 netball teams playing finals this year,
- Rising Star Womens being the first Senior TVAFNC team to play in a Grand Final.
- Ash Patton being invited to the AFLW draft combine this year!
- Senior Womens coming 3rd in the Queanbeyan AFLW preseason cup.
- Representative sports Seniors U22's, ACT Rep, AFL NSW/ACT Rep, Giants Development/Academy, Tuggeranong Netball Rep, ACT School Sports in both AFL and Netball and the list goes on.
- Milestones and individual achievements with some special ones like Kat Ghirardello's 200 1st grade games, Billie Morton and Aiden Henderson winning league B&F, and an impressive 27 players named in the top 10 in the respective grades.

To the board - thank you yet again for a fantastic year. At the beginning of the year, we launched our strategic plan with clear lines of action for the year. I feel we have achieved them and then some. Well done and thank you!

To our incredible sponsors. You don't ask or expect much and yet are so important and supportive of us. Put simply, we don't exist without you and are so grateful you believe in us through your continued investment. For this, we thank you.

To all our coaches and managers - well done on a great year. The growth and success we have seen at the individual and team level both on and off the field is testament to your incredible efforts.

Congratulations again to our appointed head men's and women's coaches for seasons 2025 and 2026, Paul Highmore and Sam Robinson and Will Prowse. You are all set to do big things!

A massive thanks to Leo Lahey who steps down as women's head coach at the end of this season. Leo has built a tremendous women's program that is on the right path to success, along with his many other contributions as president over the years. So, a huge thanks Leo for your commitment and dedication.

It is only now as I step away from the board, that I reflect on so many incredible memories made over the last 13 years, from interstate pre-season carnivals, community nights, season launches, charity rounds, social nights, the amalgamation, COVID and training in groups of 10, managing 1st grade men's, three Junior Clubs of the Year awards and Life Membership. 
