This was the game we were waiting for, from the last time we played. We had pushed them really hard but fell short by about 40 odd points. We thought at the time we were unlucky not to be closer.

The build up to this game had been really good with everyone having the focus on what we wanted to achieve. We spoke prior to the game about getting off to a good start and how important it was to put the pressure on early.

Unfortunately we had lost Annie to a concussion and we seemed to lose that drive we had used so well.

Coming into the last and we still believed we could go on with it and make up the 12 points we were behind. The temperature had also dropped by this time and it was almost icicle conditions which also made it quite difficult. I think for the last quarter we had the ball in our 50 for the majority of the time but just could hit the scoreboard, probably due to about 30 players all in there vying for that goal or to clear it away from our goals. Very crowded and we learnt some valuable lessons from that. Unfortunately we just could carry on the good form from the 1st half and went down by 12 points in the end, but an amazing turnaround from the 2 previous encounters and we should be proud to know that other teams are really aware that we have arrived as a very competitive outfit.

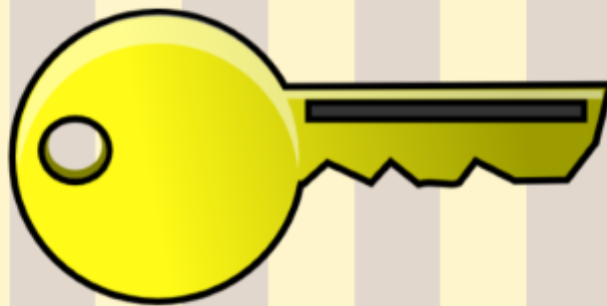

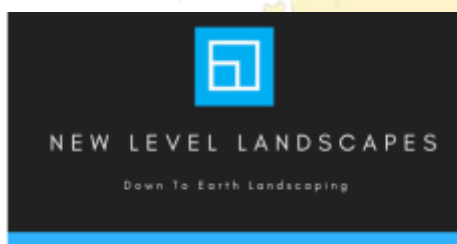
