After a poor last outing a more determined Hawks set themselves to improve our game structure and efforts to the contest. We started well with the first goal from DJ, returning from Injury, and were working well defensively. We had some unrewarded inside offensive 50 efforts and the Magpies rebounded with a goal and some points but we scored the next and were up mid-way through the 1st. Again, a couple of unforced errors and turnovers allowed the magpies to set up a 15-point lead at the first break. We felt we were in the contest and apart from a few skill errors and some structure adjustments the confidence in continuing our efforts was generally high. Unfortunately, despite a determined start, a strong momentum shift to the Magpies saw them breaking our lines and exposing our weaknesses defensively up the ground. This resulted in them pile on 14 scoring shots to our nil. The "re-occurring nightmare" with our skill errors and turnovers was again the main culprit. We tried to address this at half time with a couple of positional changes, we canned a new game strategy that was good but being new we have not completely got it right in execution and it was impacting other defensive areas. Another determined start but again we could not remain strong enough and the re-occurring skill/turnover nightmare was continuing. Some great patches again that resulted in 4 scoring shots, but the Magpies continually fed off our errors and had a return of 10 scoring shots. In situations like this we focus heavily on the systems and effort to those systems which was pretty much the message from Yowie at the 3/4rd quarter break. To the teams credit we started the last ¼ strongly and dominated the game early and had a sustained effort for the majority of the last. We still made some mistakes which punished us on the scoreboard but in general, we finished the game with some positives going into this week. The Andretta boys were again strong as was Bill Toy. Lovey bagged a couple and provided some good work around the ground with Logan Gary also showing a stronger performance. Lochie Tilly has been a revelation this season and continued show great improvement in his game-based efforts and understanding of his role. Everyone showed patches but again the stronger for longer ethos needs to be embraced.


“Magic” in 2019

He was also named in the centre for the “Team of the Hawk” in 2015 (recognising the club's era since the shift to the "Hawks" name and colours in 2003).


